Our activities

MA in Latin American Studies

The MA Program in Latin American studies, an initiative of the Institute of Latin American Studies and of the Department of International Relations and European Integration within the National University of Political Studies and Public Administration, is undergoing accreditation and is expected to welcome its first generation of students in Latin American Studies for the 2014-2015 academic year.

Through its bilingual (English and Spanish) courses, the Program's purpose is to introduce students to the developments in the Latin American space, to analyse phenomena triggering various actions and above all, to attempt to predict relations between the states in this area and the European Union, the US or other relevant actors in the international system.

The Program aims to become a regional point of interest for those intending to complete their training in international relations and to acquire expertise in Latin American issues..

Transversal Competencies Training Module

Differences in educational and employment opportunities as well as an unbalanced income distribution are structural phenomena in the Euro-Latin American space. There exists an important consensus on the need to develop basic skills, key skills, and general and transversal competencies for all people, including technological and social skills. In this regard, the Transversal Competencies Training Module, organized within the "Competence, quality, flexibility and employability in the education offer of master programs", co-financed from the European Social Fund through the Sectoral Operational Programme Human Resources Development 2007-2013, provided the opportunity for our students to complete their education.

Intensive International Relations Module

Between 5-8 May 2014, the Department of International Relations and European Studies hosted an Intensive International Relations Module, directed by M. Peter Volten, professor of International Relations and Organizations, University of Groningen, former Director at the Centre for European Security Studies of Groningen. This module was designed for advanced International Relations students who are interested in pursuing independent academic research in addition to their academic coursework.

About one hundred academics, politicians and the diplomatic corps gathered on March 6 to discuss, under the auspices of the EU-LAC Foundation and the Ibero-American General Secretariat (SEGIB) on "Latin America and the Caribbean in the context of changes: Opportunities and challenges for the EU." The forum, held at the Representation of the city-state of Hamburg in Berlin, was inaugurated by the President of the EU-LAC Foundation, Benita Ferrero-Waldner, and counted with Enrique Iglesias, the Ibero-American Secretary, as a guest of honour. The interventions of Ferrero-Waldner and Iglesias were preceded by welcoming remarks of the Secretary of State of the Senate of Hamburg, Wolfgang Schmidt, and the Secretary of State of the German Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Stephan Steinlein.
