What are the areas that really interest us? I think they are clearly the areas of investment, infrastructure or higher education (Andreea Marian)

It is important to be aware of the past and present cultural, scientific, intellectual and social diversity and exchanges between individuals, countries and regions within the wide EU-CELAC area, with a view to determinate new ideas. (Andreea Vajda)

One domain in which the EU and LAC should work together is connected to the political system and democracy.
