## Chile: the innovation and entrepreneurship hub of South America

Chile is leading Latin America in innovation and entrepreneurship programs and policies. Among the initiatives that support entrepreneurial ecosystem development, the project Start-Up Chile is by far the most successful. This acceleration program which has gained international admiration

was launched by the Chilean government to encourage high-potential entrepreneurs to found their startups in Chile and to stimulate the entrepreneurial activity. Besides the connection with mentors and investors, each selected entrepreneur is awarded with a work visa and \$40,000 seed capital. The application process for Start-up Chile Seed 2016 is currently open. The call is open for startups from all sorts of industries, but this year the focus is on Robotics, Healthcare & Biotech, Clean Energy and Education.
